
### **LEARN HOW TO**

### MAKE A PAPER-BEADED BRACELET

1

### THE PAPER & SHAPE


- **a.** Measure 1/2-inch by 6-inch triangles on the paper being used. About 10 strips will create a bracelet.
- **b.** Use scissors or a paper cutter to cut out each triangle.

### **THE BEADS**

- **a.** Place a bamboo skewer (or a toothpick) on the wide edge of the paper strip. Add a line of glue at both ends of the paper. Start rolling the wide strip of paper toward the point, using the bamboo skewer to keep its shape.
- **b.** Add a light coat of craft glue to the outside of the bead to make sure it's secure. Continue this process until you have formed all of the beads.



- **C.** Allow the glue on the beads to dry completely before completing the next step.
- **d.** Seal by adding a layer of modge podge to each bead.
- e. Allow all of the beads to dry fully (about an hour or so).

### SUPPLIES

Paper

(magazines, scrapbook paper, junk mail, printer paper, etc.)

- Scissors or Paper Cutter
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Bamboo Skewer or Toothpick
- String
- Modge Podge Gloss
- Craft Glue




THE BRACELET


a Refere cutting the

- a. Before cutting the string for the bracelet, wrap it around the wrist to measure the size. Add an additional 3 inches to the length to give room to tie the bracelet.
- **b.** Begin making your bracelet by stringing the beads onto the string.
- **c.** Tie a firm knot at either end to keep the beads in place.









### COLOR & MATCH FLAG OF MADAGASCAR




### COLOR & MATCH FLAG OF TANZANIA






### COLOR & MATCH FLAG OF UGANDA
